SAC are to be asked to review the work as it appears to be just tarmac, rather than stone. The £100k bond is not likely to be sufficient to cover the cost of the collapsing soft verges, potholes, bridge damage etc and PPCC suggest SAC survey road conditions prior to planning permission and then establish an appropriate bond for road repairs and the removal of turbines, concrete and access roads. •	SAC's new roads manager is to be asked to contact JMcA and PW to arrange to view poor local road conditions and resulting accident risk.	AO
•	 Bulk fuel community purchase project is ongoing. Vacancies: Secretary and community councillor. A new community councillor may be proposed at the next meeting. He has contacted 3 consultants to quote and a small grant application will cover the £600 cost. It will take approximately 4 weeks. Concerns were expressed as to available volunteers for the project should it prove suitable. CS seconded the proposal and all agreed. Louise Fyfe agreed to inform Lesley Bloomer. Transport meeting will be held with Stagecoach to discuss bus services. Resident requests SAC should address the increasing problem of ragwort, which is banned and poisonous to animals.
