PH said that the former Clydesdale Bank building in Ayr was to be used for open markets which would allow the building to be used continuously.

The issue with the proposed 3G pitch in Girvan continued to be controversial and would be heard at the Sheriff Court in order to hear a variation in the use of the ground which will still remain Common Good.

PH reported on the proposed alteration of the traffic light sequence at Stumpy Corner in Girvan, with possible widening of the corner. This would start in September with the road closed for a few days.

The core cluster flats, to be occupied by adults with additional needs, are now allocated. This will free up several council owned properties for rental.

The new travellers' site in Girvan is now complete.

Hadyard Hill Community Benefit Fund (HHCBF) has reported that there are four expressions of interest to buy Brunston, which will now go to a closing date.

A meeting with fund providers has accepted most of the issues. This will now go to the three Councils. Community councils will now have more control over funding. Foundation Scotland (FS) will be coming to the next PPCC meeting in September.
