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### INVITE OFFICIAL OPENING INWHERRY SCHOOL!

You are invited to the Official Opening of the Old Pinwherry Primary School, Main Street, Pinwherry, KA26 0RN on Thursday 30th March 2pm - 4pm.

Pinwherry and Pinmore Community Development Trust acquired the former school site April in 2021 after a successful Community Asset Transfer South Ayrshire Council. Since this time, we have secured funding to refurbish the building into a community facility and we are delighted that the capital works to redevelop the north end of the



building are now complete. We would love to invite the community to join us to celebrate the formal opening of our brand new, accessible, multi-purpose, warm and welcoming community space!

The next phase of capital works to redevelop the south end of the building will be completed in the spring of 2024, after which time the whole building will be open to the community to use.

## Pinwherry Primary School – **FULLY FUNDED!**

We have some fantastic news to share with the community – we have secured all the funding required to complete the refurbishment of the main Pinwherry School building!

The redevelopment of Pinwherry School is being carried out in 3 Phases:

- Phase I is the essential repairs of both buildings, which is now complete.
- Phase 2 is the redevelopment of the north end of the building which includes the accessible toilet, meeting room, IT room and open coffee/ display space, which is also complete.
- Phase 3 is the redevelopment of the south end of the building, which encompasses the main hall, kitchen, entrance area, toilet block, store rooms and second accessible toilet.

## Pinwherry Cosy and Working Space



## Help us Name our new Pinwherry Field

In the coming weeks we will be installing rainwater harvesting equipment, to include tanks, guttering and solar powered pumping amongst other things, to the portacabins on the community field. This will enable us to have running water for the toilets and sinks.

We have also applied for funding for materials and equipment to create raised beds, a pergola, an equipment shed, a polytunnel and rainwater butts. We will know the outcome of this funding application in April.

## Pinmore Play Park Project

We have been working with David Lowdon, Development Officer for Parks and Open Spaces of South Ayrshire Council to obtain quotes for the installation and subsequent on-going maintenance of play park equipment, a Multi Use Games Area (MUGA), picnic area and outdoor adult exercise equipment on Pinmore Green. The land is owned by the local Housing Authority and they have given permission for new play park facilities. No planning permission is required, as the project will be under the permitted development threshold.

The total cost for the installation of all proposed elements is £109,246.20, which is broken down into:

- £48,610.00 play park
- £12,836.20 picnic area (additional quote of £3,067.20 included for picnic area surfacing)
- £30,000 MUGA
- £17,450 outdoor adult exercise equipment
- £350 RPII Post installation inspection

The total cost for the maintenance for 10 years is £7,000, with an average of £500 per year. The total cost for the inspections for 10 years is £5,250, which is inclusive of weekly inspections of all items, vehicle and fuel and staff time.
