The Board had an online meeting with our architect on 8th February. Gordon will start initial surveys now pending funds being finalised.

Funding Update:

AB reported that there is £66371.14 of restricted funding in the bank. EDF have started taking direct debits for the electricity bill. They have however debited us £1500 twice and MM is pursuing repayment. RCGF grant letter still outstanding, but SAC representative is chasing on behalf of AW. AW to establish if we have to re-tender Phase 3 costings.

ARIA funding grant for 'Cosy Space' furniture – acceptance letter signed by AB and BD. AW will pass on details of what is to be purchased to AB **Action AW and MM**

Pinwherry Field Project

NG reported that EVO Energy are donating hedging plants to community projects. NG will pursue on behalf of the Trust. JR and BD undertook to do the planting around the car park area once the plants are received. **Action NG, JR and BD**

Pinmore Green Play Project:

Fiona Ross of SAC has provided some rough costings, viz:

Annual inspection £25pa

Equipment and surface maintenance £500pa

SAC will carry out the above for the 1st 10 years with an approximate total cost of £7000

It is envisioned that SAC approved and maintained equipment will be covered by their insurance for the 10 year duration

AOCB

There was a discussion regarding creating more 'targeted' email addresses. For clarity we will maintain the status quo, however a booking email address and system will be adopted idc

BD asked the meeting to consider what sort of artwork/photographs we should have on the walls. AB has the original artwork as used on the community information posters. She will look these out and pass to BD to investigate framing costs. **Action AB and BD**

Launch event will take place on 30th of March. A list of potential invitees (other than the community) was approved (app 1). BD will investigate organising a finger buffet. **Action AW and BD**

Pinwherry School - Funding

I have written and submitted the shortfall funding application for phase 3 for £33,924.42 to the Pinwherry and Pinmore Community Fund. The panel meeting is on 6 th March, so we should know the outcome shortly after that.

Pinwherry School - Architects

Marie, Brian, Jean and I had a Teams meeting with Gordon on 8 th February to discuss the way forwards with the next stage. Gordon has been informed of the timescales with the funding and understands that we won't have full confirmation of all match funding in place until mid-March (hopefully!), however he is able to start the initial surveys over the next few weeks to get the project underway.

I'm still waiting to receive the grant offer letter from RCGF to find out the conditions of the RCGF grant and whether we would be required to re-issue a tender for the building works, or if we can go ahead and use the same builders and also which dates the invoices must be dated within. I've chased this up with Milissa at the Council as this information will be needed soon for Gordon to plan ahead with the project. She phoned today saying SAC have still not received anything through from the Scottish Government.

Pinwherry School Furnishings

I applied to The Ayrshire Rural and Islands Ambition Fund (ARIA Fund) for equipment and furniture for the left side of the building, focusing on combatting the cost of living crisis, to meet the fund criteria. We found out on 7 th February that we were successful and will receive funding for the following:
